Youth MUST contact the Merit Badge counselor PRIOR to the event, being sure to cc another adult (preferably parent) on any e mail or text communications, per YPT policy.

The Scout needs to have read the merit badge pamphlet BEFORE the session and be prepared for each of the requirements. The purpose of the Boy Scout Merit Badge sessions is to test the Scout to determine if the requirements are fulfilled. You must also be able to demonstrate the necessary knowledge for ALL of the requirements. The Scout must have completed all at-home requirements for this badge, and must be prepared to demonstrate any necessary skills or show any required materials to the Merit Badge Counselor.

Note: remember attendance in class does not mean a Scout will complete the Merit Badge. The scout's knowledge and ability will be tested to BSA standards. Each scout will be interviewed by a counselor. Only the requirements met will be signed off.

Completion of workbook does not guarantee Merit Badge Sign off.
